- Assist with the development of Regional Fire Management Plans and Property Fire Plans
- Maintain liaison with all land users, agencies and government departments relevant to fire issues
- Take command and control of wildfire situations
- Assist with the development and support of volunteer bush fire brigades
- Training stakeholders in wildfire fighting
- Develop and implement public awareness and education programs
- Manage a regional budget
- Provide secretarial support to the regional committee
- Vehicle and equipment maintenance
- Preparing written reports
